Gold Award Spotlight

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award a Girl Scout can earn. It shows colleges, employers, and communities that girls are dedicated, determined, and accountable for changing the world! These girls are planning and executing incredible projects that have sustainable impacts on their communities.



Rachel's Gold Award improved trail accessibility, nature education, and wildlife habitats within Oak Ridge Park. Making a section of the trail accessible yearround, she designed and constructed a 58 foot, ADA-accessible boardwalk with a floating observation dock. She organized a sawmill demonstration at the local teen center where teens learned how a fallen tree from the park was turned into usable lumber for the construction of the boardwalk. Educating the public about local flora and fauna, Rachel installed 20 tree identification signs and conducted tree walks teaching community members about local trees. She placed a multistage geocache educating visitors about local animals. Rachel constructed two small mammal homes and installed two bat boxes ensuring small mammals have habitats to thrive.

I am the oldest of four children and we all had good experiences as Girl Scouts (my two sisters and me) and Boy Scouts (my brother). I know that my mother's experience in Girl Scouts was a motivating factor for all of us to be involved in Scouting.

My first experience as a Brownie involved learning craft skills to make a Mother's Day present. I learned from my Brownie friends how to use colored inks on cotton towels to make a beautiful hand towel that my mother used every day.

As I moved along the Girl Scout ladder of experience, I gained new knowledge and skills and earned a sash full of badges. I also had a two-week camp experience at Camp Deer Trails. I loved the outdoors, the camp fires and songs. I learned flag etiquette and how to stay on a greased watermelon in the water.

During the summer when I was in high school, I was a camp counselor at Wacousta.I led hikes around the area and taught basic camping skills involving cooking over a camp fire and how to pitch a small tent.
