Lansing Fab 5 Event

Girl Scouts Celebrate 100th Anniversary

The start of a historic celebration called for a historic setting and that's why we chose Lansing for our first Fab Five event in early March to kickoff GSHOM's yearlong celebration of the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouting.

The selection of our state capitol to serve as the backdrop for the Lansing Sing-along underscored the significance of the occasion which began with a welcome from our CEO Jan Barker. As she stood on the steps of the State Capitol building looking out at a sea of girls, their family members and adult volunteers gathered on the lawn, Jan could not help but smile as she delivered remarks to officially open the daylong festivities.

There was a parade followed by the singing of traditional Girl Scout songs on the lawn. More than 1,200 girls accompanied by their troop leaders or family members joined in the Sing-along before heading off to enjoy a day filled with activities including exhibits at the Michigan Historical Museum; visits to Potter Park Zoo; and a Radio Disney concert with fireworks at the Lansing Lugnuts baseball stadium.

Leaders and girls said they felt privileged to be part of the once-in-a-lifetime centennial celebration.

Kalamazoo Invasion

Girl Scouts from throughout Michigan converged on the city of Kalamazoo June 1-2 for an event celebrating the 100th anniversary.

More than 1,000 girls, their family members and volunteers participated in the event dubbed the "Kalamazoo Invasion" by staff with Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan which hosted the two-day gathering.

Many of the girls chose to spend Saturday night in dorms at Western Michigan University which gave them an opportunity to see what it's like to be on a college campus. On Saturday they marched in the Doo Dah Parade, attended the Greekfest and participated in other activities throughout the day at the Program and Training Center and other locations in Kalamazoo.

GSHOM's theme for the parade featured girls dressed up as Girl Scouts from years past.

"We did the Doo Dah Parade and used walkers and I wore a bandana around my head," said Holley Ebeling, with Troop #80208 in Battle Creek.

After the parade, Holley and other members of her troop visited the Kalamazoo Valley Museum, participated in a scavenger hunt and activities at the PATC. But, the parade remained her favorite part of the day.

"I hope Girl Scouts will be around for another 100 years," Holley said. "It's a good organization that teaches us many things."

Megan Goshorn, a member of Troop #80295, said she was looking forward to the Glow Dance. The dance was held in the Bernhard Student Center on Western Michigan University's campus and featured music, neon and crafts.

Lisa Goshorn, Megan's mom and the leader of her troop, said her troop was planning to attend each of the Fab Five events.

Extraordinary Women's Group Supports Girl Scouts for 84 Years

In 1928, when the Harbor Beach Women's Club wanted to lend a helping hand to younger women in their community, they could have launched a junior women's club. Instead, they chose to start a Girl Scout troop.

The Harbor Beach Women's Club has been a best friend of Girl Scouts ever since. For 84 years, the club has made it possible for girls to become Girl Scouts, donating funds for membership dues, handbooks and badge, sashes, and vests. That's why Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan honored the club with a special award, marking the group's generosity during the 100th anniversary year of Girl Scouting.

Speaking at the award presentation, Jan Barker, CEO, said, "Nobody has been supporting Girl Scouting as long as the Harbor Beach Women's Club has. This group is amazing!"

It was a sweet moment for Toni O'Neil. The retired elementary teacher from rural Port Hope has been a Girl Scout since she was seven years old. She began volunteering with the Girl Scouts in this Upper Thumb town while attending Central Michigan University. O'Neil has served as a troop leader, day camp leader, camp counselor, trainer, and as a national convention delegate.

"Girl Scouts is so empowering for girls," she said. "Although it has changed over the years to keep up with the changes in technology, the basic morals and ethics, values that have been part of Girl Scouts since the beginning, have endured."

"The Harbor Beach Women's Club has accomplished great things," said O'Neil.

"These women are leaders, in their homes, careers and in the community. As Girl Scouts, we are proud to be associated with them."

Super-sized Jamboree and Pow Wow

Our Jamboree is one of our most eagerly anticipated annual gatherings, but this year's event had a special significance for the more than 1,000 girls, their family members and adult volunteers who took over Camp O' the Hills in Brooklyn.

Not only was it the third of our Fab Five events, but it was also supersized which meant everything happened on a much grander scale.

Alex Slaughter, a member of Troop 40347 who attends West Middle School in Plymouth, said she attended previous Fab Five events in Lansing and Kalamazoo and really wanted to be involved with the Pow Wow and Jamboree.

Before the Grand Entry ceremony, Alex had tried out her dance moves; made slime and goo, bubbles and a rocket; and worked with a padded egg.

At age 11, Alex has been involved in Girl Scouts since Kindergarten.

"I love all the fun trips we go on. We've been to Frankenmuth and had a sleepover at the Binder Park Zoo," Alex said. "Being a Girl Scout has taught me to always be nice to others and to always keep my cool."

Sheridan Leinbach, a member of Troop 30411 in Lansing, said she has been a Girl Scout for two years. She said she joined a troop to make friends and meet new people.

"Girl Scouts has taught me to share," Sheridan said.

Karlee Morgan, a member of Troop 60268 in Tecumseh, said Girl Scouts has taught her to help and be respectful of other people. She was one of many girls who learned how to scuba dive in a pool which had been set up for the event complete with an underwater camera.

"It was kind of hard swimming around with an air tank and flippers on," Karlee said.

In addition to the immersion in all things Native American, girls and adult volunteers were able to participate in a plethora of activities which were part of the Jamboree.

The activity level wound down a bit in the evening as the crowd gathered to hear Grammy-award winning flutist Joseph Firecrow make beautiful music.

Firecrow's melodies were a fitting way to end a meaningful and magical day for all who were lucky enough to be there.

Alumnae Spotlight

Mary Beth Sanborn

Mary Beth Sanborn has seen plenty of changes in the 80 years since she became a Girl Scout.

The one constant, she says, is Girl Scout camp which continues to offer a uniquely girl-driven experience with the same activities she enjoyed. Learning to make a fire to keep warm and cook with, swimming and canoeing remain key components of the organizations camps.

"I feel that there are organizations where you can get things like art and sports," said Mary Beth, who lives in St. Joseph. "No place except the Girl Scouts do you get camping, especially for girls."

Mary Beth, now 90, and her two sisters were raised in Muscatine, Iowa with an appreciation for the outdoors and given every opportunity to pursue their interests in a supportive family environment. Going to college was never a question of "if", but rather "when."

"When I was 10 a good friend had twin sisters who were 18 and they were balls of fire the two of them," Mary Beth said. "We talked another one of our friends who was 21 into being the leader so the twins could be assistants. We did so much."

In addition to being in a troop, Mary Beth helped her mother with her Girl Scout troops. There were no Brownie troops in that area back then.

Among the highlights of her time as an active Girl Scout was the Golden Eaglet she earned at age 16.

After graduating from high school, Mary Beth earned a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education from the University of Iowa and took a teaching job at a junior high school in Galesburg, Illinois.

Several years later, she earned a Master's degree in Audiovisual Arts and moved to Glenview, III.

While there she helped lead a senior Girl Scout troop. Her "to do" list included finding a place for the girls to camp. She located a Camp Shawadassee in Lawton, Mich. that would take out-of-state girls.

The troop went for one week and Mary Beth stayed on to help run the camp in 1962. In 1962 after she took camp director training she was appointed director for the

entire camping season. Following that she was named executive director of Girl Scouts Southwest Michigan Council headquartered in St. Joseph, Mich. It was a nobrainer for Mary Beth.

After three years there, she was hired as the executive director and camp director for what is now the Singing Sands Council headquartered in St. Joe.


"Most women who go into the Girl Scouts don't have the vaguest notion of how to go camping," Mary Beth said. "Training was the thing I did most, mostly camps, but I was willing to help with any training."

Her age and the recent relinquishing of her prized driver's license have not stopped her from continuing her involvement with the Girl Scouts.

"I'm still active in Girl Scouts when there's an opportunity," Mary Beth said. "I still feel very much a Girl Scout and I encourage people to be active in it. There's no place that's as accepting of girls as the Girl Scout organization."

Juliette Gordon Low Birthday Party

Nobody knew that Juliette Gordon Low's entrance into the world 152 years ago would have such a profound and positive impact on the lives of girls all over the world.

Low's ability to foresee the difference that women would make on a national and global level was celebrated October 20 during a birthday party in her honor in Midland. The event was the fourth of five events sponsored by Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the premier leadership organization for girls.

A nationally-known magician, nature walks, historical Girl Scout exhibits, a slew of hands-on craft activities and demonstrations, and a laser light tribute to Low were just a few of the choices participants had during the party.

However, the festivities weren't all about Low which is likely how she would have wanted it.

Michelle Holmes, Program Specialist in GSHOM's Saginaw Regional office, said the organizing committee for the birthday party wanted to include a service project as a way to give back to the community. Cake and cupcake mixes, frosting, candles and birthday-themed paper products were among the items GSHOM asked individuals to contribute.

The donations were given to area shelters which don't have money in their coffers for such-non-essential items.

But, non-essential doesn't mean "not needed", said Sister Marietta Fritz with the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, who is executive director of Emmaus House in Saginaw.

"This will definitely assist our women in enjoying another slice of life that they're not used to celebrating such as birthdays and anniversaries and new accomplishments in their lives," Sister Marietta said. "We don't have money for this. We depend on what people give us."

Emmaus House provides a stable environment for women who are released from jail or prison or alcohol and drug rehabilitation centers.

"Our purpose is to help women and provide them with shelter, clothes and transportation so they can care for themselves," Sister Marietta said, adding that the birthday items will go a long way to making life more enjoyable for women at the shelter.

In addition to Emmaus House, Holmes said the birthday goods also were distributed to the Bay Area Women's Center in Bay City, Eva's Place in Sandusky, and Shelter, Inc. in Alpena.

Holmes said more than 400 items were collected.


