



Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan 2010 Mackinac Island Governor's Honor Guard Patrol # 7901 - Girl Application



For Girl Scouts currently in 6th through 12th grades.

The Mackinac Island, Michigan State Commission has again selected Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan to serve as the Governor's Honor Guard. Our group, known by the Commission as Patrol #7901, will serve from August 28-September 6, 2010.

Eligibility and Selection:

If you are a registered Heart of Michigan Girl Scout currently in 6th through 12th grade you are eligible to apply for the Governor's Honor Guard. Girl Scouts who attend Mackinac Island Honor Scout Service Camp must be trustworthy, responsible and mature.

In order to become a member of the Honor Guard, you must be willing to dedicate yourself to serving the State of Michigan and representing your Council. Your flag duty, guide duty, your service project and even kitchen duties come before personal free time and other selected activities. You will have plenty of free time, but we want you to know **SERVICE** comes first.

Program Fee Information:

The program fee is \$275 per girl to cover expenses such as weekend training sites and food, transportation by charter bus to and from the island and food while on the island. If you are selected as a member of this year's Mackinac Island Honor Scouts, you will be able to apply for financial aid if needed.

Girls are required to purchase a dress Unit A uniform and a causal Unit B uniform. Exact uniform requirements will be provided at the orientation meeting in January. The cost is approximately \$190 for all items except shoes.

After a girl has been selected and part or the entire total fee has been paid, refunds will be made only if: (1) a replacement girl is available or (2) if we are notified as soon as possible that illness or injury make cancellation necessary. You must follow up with a written request from parent/guardian and provide a physician's statement. Refunds, if given, will be made after our service on Mackinac Island.

Honor Guard Dates to Remember:

If you are selected you must be committed to attending each of the training sessions. If after reviewing your schedule and current commitments, you have verified that you can make a commitment to the program, please apply. If you cannot make the commitment required please reconsider your application.

Application Process:

An application and two reference forms must be submitted by the deadline for those who wish to apply. *The references must be from non-family members.* They should be from adults you have demonstrated your level of responsibility and maturity to. A stamped addressed envelope should be given to each person you are requesting a reference from. These should **NOT** be returned to you, but mailed directly to the M.I.H.S. Staff Advisor as indicted on the reference form. It is advised that you check with your references in a week or two to be sure that they have not forgotten to send a reference for you.
