

Our camps are also licensed through the state of Michigan and adhere to Girl Scout Safety Activity Checkpoints. We comply with industry standards in health, safety, and program quality; and our camps are inspected by the state of Michigan and are reviewed by the ACA every year.

Staff Training

At Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan (GSHOM), we believe staff training is of utmost importance. Our summer camp staff participate in more staff training than what is required by the state of Michigan, to ensure your camper receives the best experience possible. Staff are given advanced training and certifications in First Aid and CPR, youth development theory, group management and coaching, high adventure activity facilitation, and emergency procedures. All camp staff undergo a thorough application process, including background checks, reference checks, and interviews. Many campers love their experience so much that they return as Program Aides, Counselors in Training, and Junior Counselors before moving on to become camp staff!

Safety

At Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan, the safety of our campers is our top priority. Safe fun and achievement are an essential part of camp. We take the care of your camper very seriously, while challenging her to reach her full potential. Every activity is planned well in advance, and staff are trained to safely facilitate all adventures. If minor injuries do occur, staff are trained in adult and pediatric First Aid/CPR/AED. Our overnight camps also have dedicated Health Officers with advanced First Aid and CPR training, who operate under standing orders from an on-call physician. The Camp Director or Health Officer will contact you in the unlikely event that your camper gets sick or injured.

Equity

Equity is highly valued at Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan. Camp is a remarkable place where campers can gain self-reliance and feel the sense of belonging regardless of where they call home. Through varied activities, they gain independence and courage to tackle new challenges while increasing their social skills with a diverse group of other campers. Girl Scout Camp, by design, encourages campers to build their confidence, creativity, teamwork, and critical thinking skills. Staff at GSHOM camps provide a welcoming and safe place where every person is valued for their uniqueness and extraordinary potential for growth and development.

Camp Food

Great camp food starts with great ingredients. Meals at camp are kid-friendly and healthy. Our kitchens are nut-free, and our certified Kitchen Directors can work to accommodate dietary needs. If your camper has any food allergies or dietary restrictions, be sure to list them in detail on the health form at registration. This allows us to plan ahead to ensure that everyone has food that accommodates their needs while they are at camp. Spots fill up fast, so plan ahead!

Summer



Camp Linden: overnight camp, troop camp opportunities, weekend programs, day programs, horses get to camp, sunsets over the lake.

Camp Merrie Woode: overnight camp, troop camp opportunities, weekend programs, day programs, sunsets, and stargazing.

Camp O'the Hills: troop camp opportunities, weekend programs, day programs, Save the Turtles programs, fireflies light up the night sky.

Fall



Camp Linden: troop camping (hike through fall colors, archery), weddings, Harvest Festival.

Camp Merrie Woode: troop camping (create your own adventures together), weddings, encampments.

Camp O'the Hills: troop camping (hike through fall colors, archery), weddings, encampments, camp adventures

Winter



Camp Linden: winter events, troop camp opportunities (sledding/ snowshoeing/ cozy by the fire vibes).

Camp Merrie Woode: troop camp opportunities (sledding/ snowshoeing/ build a snowman!).

Camp O'the Hills: troop camping, winter adventure days, sledding, snowshoeing, cross country skiing, ice skating and ice fishing, s'mores and hot cocoa by the campfire.

Camp Linden: Linden Lock-In, troop camp opportunities (boating, climbing wall) camp open house, flowers starting to bloom, encampments, school groups.

Camp Merrie Woode: troop camp opportunities, camp open house, flowers starting to bloom, encampments, get ready for summer fun!

Camp O'the Hills: Camp Open House, troop camp opportunities, encampments, boating, camp adventures.

Overnight Camp

Overnight camp is a chance to experience the great outdoors on your own for a 4-, 6-, or 13-day session. You'll sleep in a unit, like a lodge or tent, with other campers similar in age, and camp counselors nearby to guide you through your journey at camp. You can try out a traditional camp experience with our "All Around" programs, or choose from a variety of specialty, horse, and leadership sessions designed to let you focus on skills and experiences that matter to you.



Campers can explore a series of beautiful lakes and forest trails. Camp Linden features an accessible luxury pool, climbing wall, lakefront, fairy village, horseback riding, and target sports. Throughout the year, Linden hosts events, rentals, school groups, women's retreats, encampments, and weddings. You'll learn and practice skills including navigation, hiking safety, environmental ethics, outdoor cooking, packing a backpack, and filtering water. Then, you'll head out on a hike to a primitive campsite for your overnight adventure! Here, you'll pitch tents, build a fire to cook over, and enjoy some stargazing. Campers should be able to carry a 30-lb. pack and bring comfortable, sturdy shoes for hiking.

Week 2

Entering Grades 2-5 | 6 Days

Lodge Accommodations | \$550

Ready...set...SWIM! In this program, you'll get to spend extra time in the pool while you play games, splash around, practice basic strokes, and learn how to stay safe in the water. Campers in this program should be able to tread water and swim 50 yards on their own.

Campers in this session will take the Water Safety for Kids course through the American Red Cross.

I Will Try-athlon ● ● ●

Week 3

Entering Grades 6-12 | 6 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$550

On my honor, I will try-(athlon). In this action-packed session, you train for our first ever Camp Linden Try-athlon. You'll spend time practicing strokes at the pool, cycling and running on the picturesque trails, trying out some classic camp activities, and then setting your own goals and embarking on our Try-athlon! The Try-athlon will consist of a 25 meter swim, 1 mile bike, and 1 mile run. This program is a great way to get familiar with swimming, cycling, and running.

Night Owls ● ●

Week 3

Entering Grades 4-8 | 6 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$550

Explore Camp Linden nightlife! You'll get to experience an epic night hike, discover new things about nocturnal animals, dissect owl pellets, and stay up late! You will stay up later each night and sleep in past breakfast by the end of the week. We'll make sure you have a campfire and a midnight snack to keep you going!

Campers in this session will earn and receive the Cadette Night Owls badge.

Paddle Excursion ● ● ●

Week 4

Entering Grades 6-12 | 6 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$550

Paddle your way to your next great adventure! In this program, you will spend your time on the water exploring Lake Louise, Cranberry Creek, the Twin Lakes, and more! You'll learn about boating and aquatic safety and hone your paddling skills in kayaks, canoes, rowboats, and paddle boards. After practicing these skills, weather permitting, you'll paddle out for an overnight at our primitive campsite, Paradise Point. Campers should be comfortable in a boat, able to tread water, and able to swim 50 yards unassisted.

Campers in this session will earn and receive the Senior Paddling Badge.

Camp Linden Bake-Off ● ●

Week 4

Entering Grades 2-5 | 6 Days

Lodge Accommodations | \$550

Bakers unite! In addition to classic camp activities, you'll have one activity block a day to BAKE all your dreams come true! You'll work with our Camp Kitchen Director to learn all about food safety in our industrial kitchen and bake treats for all of your camp friends. You'll also get to experiment with outdoor cooking. Participate in a judged competition at the end of the week to win a sweet surprise!

Explore-ology ● ●

Week 5

Entering Grades 4-8 | 6 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$550

Jump feet first into hands-on learning! In this ecology-based program, you will catch and release camp critters like bugs, frogs, and fish. You'll learn about our local ecosystems and food webs, then take a closer look using nets and microscopes. You'll even get to wade in the water with waders and fishing rods.

Campers in this session will earn and receive the Junior Eco Trekker Badge.

Specialty Sessions

Wild About Woodworking ●●

Week 5

Entering Grades 4-8 | 6 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$550

Whittle me this... Are you curious about the wonderful world of woodworking? In this program, you will learn all about the basics of woodworking and how to stay safe in a workshop environment. You'll build your own bird house, design and race pinewood derby cars down our camp track, work with our Camp Ranger to build a picnic table for the Fairy Village, and whittle something of your own design. When you're not working on these exciting projects, you'll get to try out some camper choice activities!

Campers in this session will earn and receive the Cadette Woodworking Badge.

On the Loose ●●●

Weeks 6

Entering Grades 6-12 | 6 Days

Lodge Accommodations | \$550

We've only got a moment, and all of Camp Linden to see. During this exciting new program, you will scratch off some big Camp Linden bucket list items. You'll paddle to Paradise Point, hike the Hogback Trail to the Meadows, sleep under the stars in Egypt, and round out the week with our very last campfire of the summer. Are you ready to explore life on the loose?

You Can't Do That at Camp! ●●

Weeks 3, 4, & 6

Entering Grades 4-8 | 6 Days

Lodge Accommodations | \$550

Breaking the rules has never been so fun! This zany and shenanigan-filled session is perfect for anyone who wants to break the rules. In addition to camper choice activities, you'll get to pull pranks, stay up past lights out, participate in a flashmob, enjoy a movie night with midnight snacks, and even have a pizza party!



Horse Sessions

Whether you've been riding for years or have never ridden a horse before, we have a horseback riding program for you! Our horse camps are the perfect opportunity to explore Camp Linden and spend time with our amazing horses! Each full day of camp, you'll get to spend one of your activity blocks at the barn growing your equestrian and riding skills, and the other two activity blocks participating in exciting camp activities! Weather permitting, Introduction to Horses includes two two-hour lessons, all six-day horseback riding sessions include four two-hour lessons, and all thirteen-day horseback riding sessions include ten lessons! Riders are encouraged to repeat sessions as necessary. It's totally normal to repeat a session, and you'll pick up and refine new skills each time.

Introduction to Horses ●●●

Weeks 1

Entering Grades 2-8 | 4 Days

3-Season Lodge Accommodations | \$480

Introduction to horses allows equestrian lovers to learn about the everyday care that goes into horses. This session allows campers who have never been around horses, or are still uneasy around them, to get to know the basics. This includes how to act around the horse, groom, barn work, anatomy, and tack care.

This session was formerly called Horse Camp Mini.

Horse Beginner ●●●

Weeks 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6

Entering Grades 2-8 | 6 Days

3-Season Lodge Accommodations | \$680

This session is for beginner riders. You will learn grooming, tacking, walking without being led by the instructor, proper riding form, how to turn your horse, emergency dismounting, and how to stop your horse. There will be morning feeding and mucking. This course covers the basics of riding and horse care.

This session was formerly called Horseback Riding Level 1.

Horse Advanced Beginner ●●●●

Weeks 3, 4, 5, & 6

Entering Grades 4-10 | 6 Days

3-Season Lodge Accommodations | \$680

This session is for the advanced beginner rider. You will learn to trot without being led by the instructor, proper riding form, how to turn your horse at a trot, and stop and back up your horse. This session will include a trail ride through Camp Linden. There will be morning feeding and mucking. This session covers the basics for walking and trotting, as well as horse care, and can be repeated as necessary to guarantee campers feel comfortable moving to faster gaits.

This session was formerly called Horseback Riding Level 2.

Pre-requisite: Completion of Horseback Riding Level 1 or Camp Director approval.

Horse Intermediate ●●●

Weeks 3 & 6

Entering Grades 6-12 | 6 Days

3-Lodge Accommodations week 3

Tent Accommodations week 6 | \$680

This session is for the intermediate rider. You will learn to canter and improve your control at the trot. This session will include a trail ride through Camp Linden, bareback riding, and beginner medical care. There will be morning feedings and mucking. This session provides the basics for horseback riding at a canter.

This session was formerly called Horseback Riding Level 3.

Pre-requisite: Completion of Horseback Riding Level 2 or Camp Director approval.

Horse Advanced Intermediate ●●●

Weeks 2-3

Entering Grades 8-12 | 13 Days

Tent Accommodations | \$1,360

This session is for the equestrian lover who is looking to advance their skills. You will learn proper riding form for cantering, how to turn your horse at a canter, barrel patterns, and stopping and backing your horse. This program will include a trail ride through Camp Linden.
