
Looking Back on our 2021-2022 Girl Scout Year!

Our 2021-2022 Girl Scout year just ended on September 30, and we are excited to share many exciting accomplishments with you. Here is our year at a glance:

- 11,266 girl members in Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan
- 5,156 volunteers making the magic happen

- 2,909 girls attended Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan programs
- 1,233 troops at Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan
- 1,475 girls participating in Community Troops
- 1,295 girls and their families attended camp
- 78 volunteers were honored at our Adult Awards celebration

Gold Award Spotlight: Vernae. H



We are deeply saddened by the passing of Girl Scout alumna Carol Grosvenor on June 29, 2022. Carol's Girl Scout story is inspiring, and she supported and inspired many girls throughout Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan.

Carol started her Girl Scout experience as a Brownie. Her first memory in Girl Scouts was when her Brownie troop learned how to use colored inks on cotton towels to make a beautiful hand towel, which she gave to her mother for Mother's Day. As she grew through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, she gained new knowledge and skills and earned a sash full of badges. She also had a two-week camp experience at Camp Deer Trails. She loved the outdoors, campfires, and songs. She learned flag etiquette and how to stand on a greased watermelon in the water!

When she was in high school, she was a camp counselor at Camp Wacousta. She led hikes around the area and taught basic camp skills, including cooking over a campfire and pitching tents.

Once Carol graduated from high school, she earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Central Michigan University, with a dual major in computer science and music. She earned a Master of Science degree in computer science from West Coast University in 1979. She also completed her certified financial planner (CFP) education requirements in 2001 and earned her CFP credential in 2002.


During Carol's life, she used the skills she acquired as a Girl Scout, specifically: leadership skills, entrepreneurship skills, and serving her community. Carol provided computer software services in the banking and computer technology industries, and upon becoming a CPF, she formed her own financial advisory

firm. She retired in 2018 after a long career as an independent financial advisor.

Carol was a lifetime Girl Scout and served on the Fund Development Committee for Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan. Carol has fond memories of her childhood and adolescent years as a Girl Scout. She supported Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan as a way to ensure the next generation of girls would have the same opportunities.

We are overwhelmed with gratitude for Carol and the legacy she left behind. May she rest in peace.

Other Ways to Support GSHOM

Did you know there are ways to support GSHOM at absolutely no extra cost to you? Here are a few simple ways to support GSHOM by just doing your day to day shopping!

AmazonSmile: AmazonSmile is a simple way for you to support GSHOM every time you shop, at no cost to you. AmazonSmile is available at smile.amazon.com on your web browser and can be activated in the Amazon Shopping app for iOS and Android phones. Simply log into smile.amazon.com and select Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan (GSHOM)! Amazon will in return donate 0.5% of the purchase price from customers' eligible AmazonSmile purchases to the charitable organizations they select.

In 2021 we raised \$958.64 with AmazonSmile program! Lets get that number to \$2000 for 2022.

Direct Your Dollar: Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan is partnering with SpartanNash to participate in the Direct Your Dollars Program! Save your D&W Fresh, Family Fare, VG's, and Martin's Super Market receipts! Every dollar raised helps us move our mission of building girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place, forward.

Direct Your Dollars is a receipt-based program, meaning that we can raise money simply by doing something we all do each week – going to the grocery store.

Every time you shop at your local D&W Fresh, Family Fare, VG's, and Martin's Super Market store, save your receipts – and encourage your friends and family to do the same. Once we've collected \$150,000 in receipts from these stores, we can turn those slips of paper into a \$1,000 check for GSHOM!
